We tend to use more water to keep horses cool when the temperatures are high, both at competitions and at home. In many areas of the country, the humidity levels also increase during this time of year, adding moisture to the air and preventing hooves from drying as quickly. What happens to a hoof with excess water is similar to what would happen to a wooden plank that's placed in a water trough: it becomes waterlogged, then softens and

It is best to tackle issues that accompany moisture by going straight to the source and minimizing the amount of water that comes in contact with the hooves. This can be accomplished in several ways: 1. Give your horse fewer baths Cutting down on how many times per day a horse is hosed can be difficult with competition horses that need to stay clean and that may be exercised, ridden, or shown several times per day. Still, it is important to be strategic

about using water, especially on the legs. At home, try to occasionally let your horse air dry in front of the fan if a bath isn't entirely necessary. Body clipping will help your horse's heat tolerance this time of year and you may not have to use the hose after every ride.
