

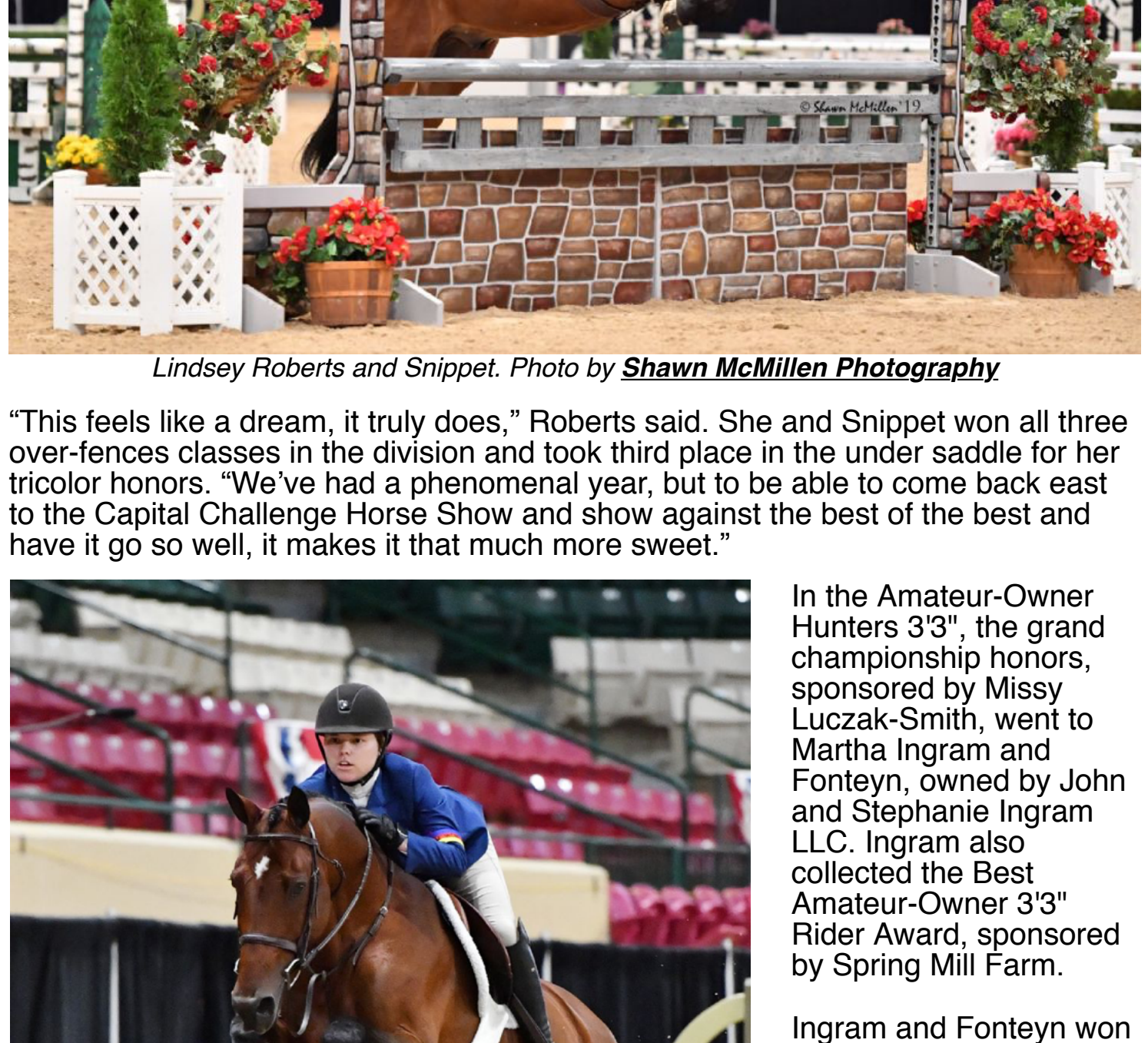

**Riders From Texas and Tennessee Claim Amateur-Owner Hunter Grand Championships at Capital Challenge Horse Show**

Upper Marlboro, Maryland – Lindsey Roberts of Kingwood, TX, riding Snippet, and Martha Ingram of Nashville, TN, aboard Fonteyn, claimed the 3'6" and 3'3" Grand Amateur-Owner Hunter Championship titles on Thursday, October 3, at the Capital Challenge Horse Show.

Sharing the Adult Amateur Hunter Grand Championship honors at the show, which continues through Sunday, October 6, at the Prince George's County Equestrian Center in Upper Marlboro, MD, were Ellen Toon on Playmaker and Vivian Yowan on Calou.

Roberts was a bit taken aback with her Amateur-Owner Hunter 3'6" Grand Championship title, sponsored by Finally Farm, which came after she had claimed the Amateur-Owner 3'6", 18-35 championship title, sponsored by The Hallman Family and MerryLegs South LLC.

"This feels like a dream, it truly does," Roberts said. She and Snippet won all three over-fences classes in the division and took third place in the under saddle for her tricolor honors. "We've had a phenomenal year, but to be able to come back east to the Capital Challenge Horse Show and show against the best of the best and have it go so well, it makes it that much more sweet."

In the Amateur-Owner Hunters 3'3", the grand championship honors, sponsored by Missy Luczak-Smith, went to Martha Ingram and Fonteyn, owned by John and Stephanie Ingram LLC. Ingram also collected the Best Amateur-Owner 3'3" Rider Award, sponsored by Spring Mill Farm.

Ingram and Fonteyn won two over-fences classes and the under saddle to top the Amateur-Owner Hunter 3'3", 18-35 division before claiming the 3'3" grand title. Ingram also emerged victorious in the World Championship Hunter Rider (WCHR) Amateur-Owner 3'3" Challenge riding Airport 48.

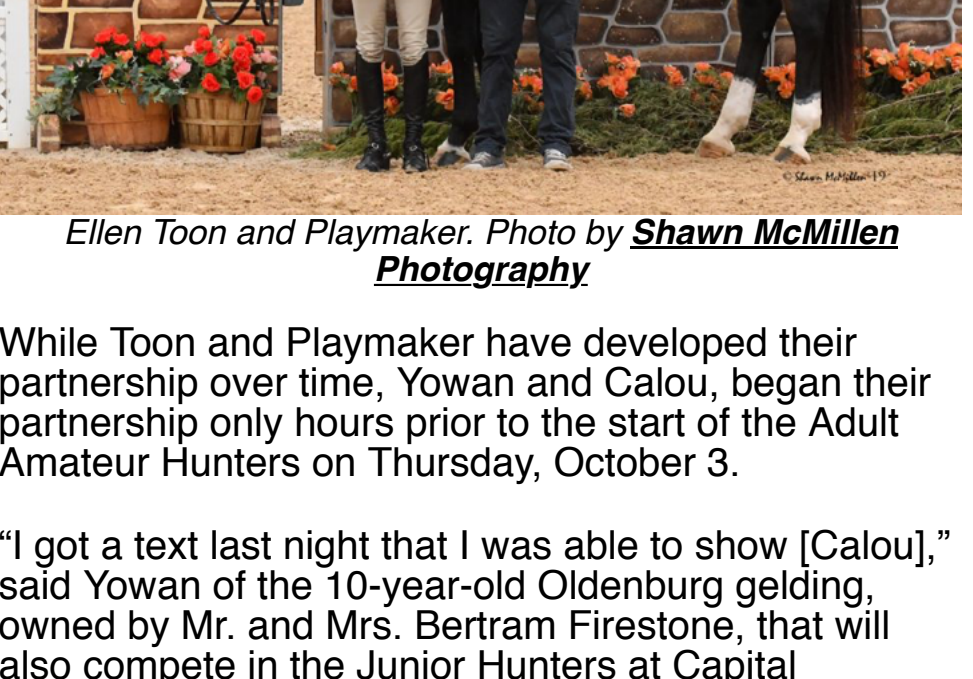

**Vivian Yowan and Ellen Toon Take Co-Grand Champion Honors in Adult Hunters**

Ellen Toon with Playmaker and Vivian Yowan with Calou shared the Grand Adult Amateur Hunter Championship title, sponsored by Steve Martines, and the Equus Challenge Trophy, donated by Equus Entries and Sue and Ralph Caggiano, after each earning 20 points in the Adult Amateur Hunters, 51 and Over and the Adult Amateur Hunters, 18-35, respectively.

"The first round was our best trip ever with me," said Toon, of South Salem, NY, who earned a score of 90.50 for both the win in the class and the Adult Amateur Hunter EMO Trip of the Show. "The second round, I didn't feel was as good on my part. I got a little deep, but he still jumped really well. He still got an 89, so that was nice."

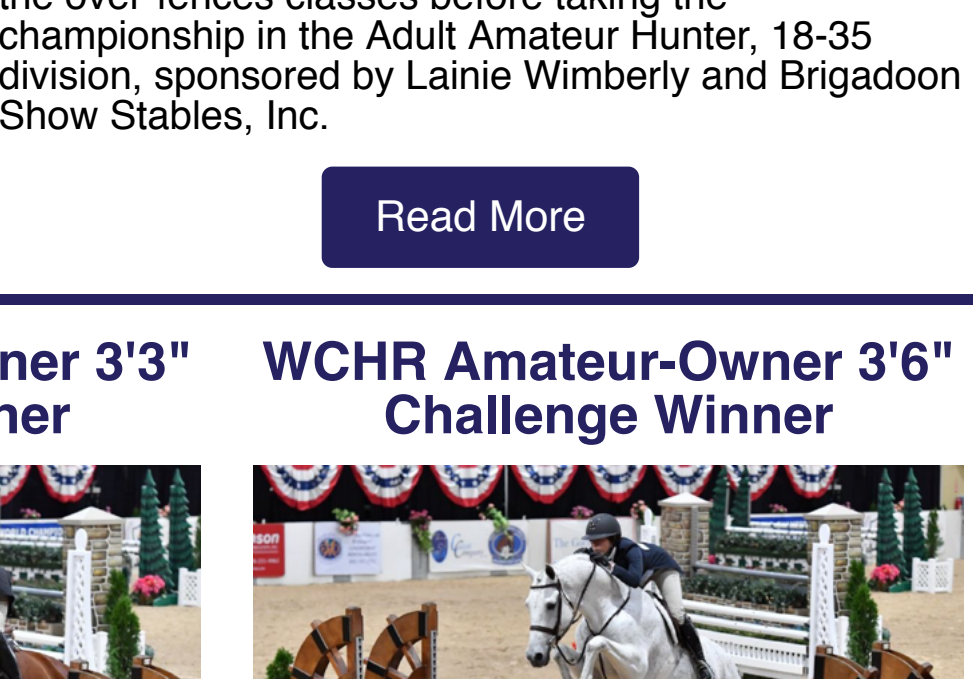
That score was enough to secure a second over-fences victory for Toon and the nine-year-old Holsteiner gelding owned by JT Farm, giving them the division championship. The division reserve championship went to Alex Stevens on her own Sky Pilot.

While Toon and Playmaker have developed their partnership over time, Yowan and Calou, began their partnership only hours prior to the start of the Adult Amateur Hunters on Thursday, October 3.

"I got a text last night that I was able to show [Calou]," said Yowan of the 10-year-old Oldenburg gelding, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Bertram Firestone, that will also compete in the Junior Hunters at Capital Challenge with Eleanor Rudnicki. "I rode him for the first time this morning, so we don't have a very long relationship!"

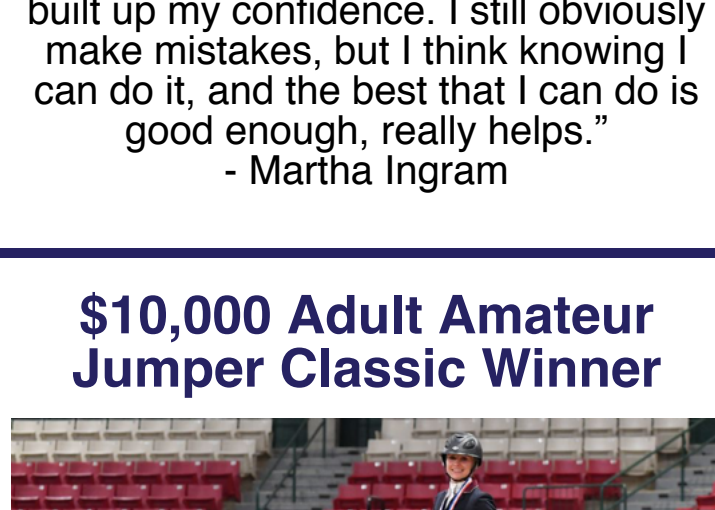

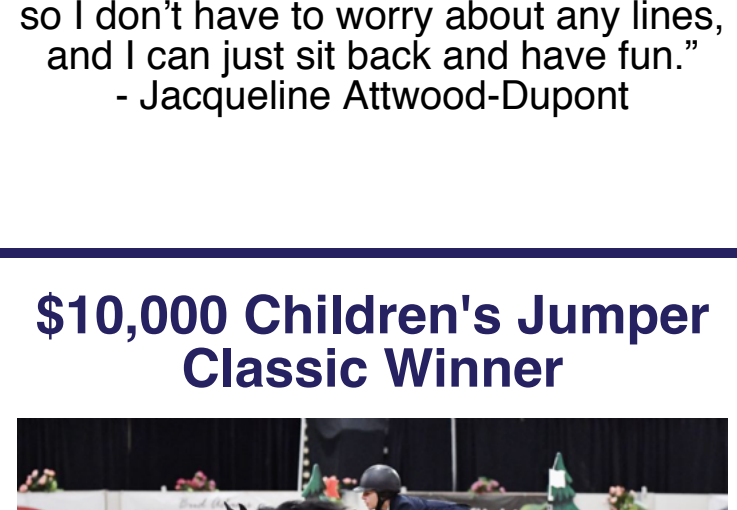

**03 Third Year in a Row For Ingram**  
 Martha Ingram galloped to her own influx at Capital Challenge when she won the \$2,500 WCHR Amateur-Owner 3'3" Challenge, sponsored by Milestone, LLC/Havens Schaff, for the third consecutive year. After taking the class in 2017 and 2018 with Lyons Creek Ball in the 22-year-old plaited Airport 48 to the victory this year with a decisive win with 89.33 points, Ingram, of Nashville, TN, entered the Capital Challenge leading the WCHR National Standings and retained the top spot as well with her solid performances throughout the week. She also claimed the 3'3" Amateur-Owner Hunter title and the 3'3" Amateur-Owner, 18-35, championship with Fonteyn after winning three of the four classes in the section. Ingram relied primarily on Airport 48 and Fonteyn for her national championship points, and Airport flew to the top for her in the WCHR 3'3" Amateur-Owner Challenge after previously being a successful 3'6" Amateur-Owner Hunter.
