The Washington International Horse Show (WIHS) is going green with the "Green Is the New Blue" initiative at the 61st annual WIHS on October 22-27 in Washington, D.C. Recycling bins will be placed throughout the event level and in stabling areas, while the show office will use recycled paper, including to print jump orders and course

maps. In addition, the prize list, regional prize list and souvenir program will be printed on recycled paper with FSC- and SFI-certified soy inks. WIHS will utilize "e-ticket" vouchers for 60 percent of ticket vouchers and the remaining

40 percent will be printed on eco-friendly paper, while the VIP will-call and ticketing system will be transferred to an online system. Instead of disposable plastic bottles, WIHS will provide water with water coolers and biodegradable cups, and branded reusable water bottles will be given to all exhibitors, trainers, vendors and staff.


