




Assistant Trainer Leigha Schrader Featured in Equestrian Living Magazine

Life in a Pandemic with 36 Critically Ill Horses

In the early morning hours of January 21, we were deployed to support law enforcement in the seizure of 20 horses. They were living in deplorable conditions on half an acre with other livestock. Sadly, one horse had already perished. The 19 survivors are now in quarantine at our facility.

Over the course of the last year, words like "quarantine" and "isolate" were used in everyday conversation. However, for the past 30 years, DEFHR staff and volunteers have used these words frequently. Every time new horses arrive, they go into strict quarantine to keep our other horses healthy. Staff and volunteers also go through a decontamination process that includes disinfecting hands and clothing every time they exit the isolation barn.

We were initially prepared for the pandemic in terms of hand sanitizer, disinfectants, personal protective equipment, and more, but the addition of 17 critically ill horses in December and now 19 critically ill horses this month have put us in an extremely challenging situation. Keeping our staff safe while managing 36 horses in quarantine requires extensive supplies and gifts-in-kind are a vital need.
