Big-Picture Planning Highlights USEF's Annual Meeting

Will Connell on the Olympic Format

WORLD OF SHOWJUMPING



U.S. Equestrian Federation (USEF) Sport Director Will Connell shared his thoughts on discussions about the Olympic format, the Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) voting system, and how the show jumping community should avoid becoming shortsighted.

At the FEI Hybrid General Assembly in November 2021, national federations (NF) voted on the proposal for the qualification system for the 2024 Olympic Games–81 NFs were in favor and 15 against–as well as on the much-debated Olympic format of three horse-and-rider combinations per team, with 70 NFs voting in favor and 30 against.

The arduous business of rulemaking, which once occupied much time at the convention, has been deferred to another occasion, allowing for big-picture planning.

Balou du Reventon Voted 2021 International Horse of the Year

Reventón means "small explosion" or "burst" in Spanish. It's a fitting description for the partnership between Balou du Reventon and the USA's Brian Moggre. The pair burst onto the scene in 2021 and promptly exploded onto the world stage, earning a career-best world ranking of 31st in July and a 2020 Tokyo Olympic team reserve spot for the 20-year-old show jumping athlete. The duo represented the U.S. at the prestigious CHIO Aachen in September and helped secure the gold medal for Team USA in the Mercedes-Benz Nations Cup CSIO5*
