


"We don't take this horse to a lot of horse shows, but every time he goes we know he will do well. He is a diva and knows that he is a really cool horse."




Charlotte Clark and Costa Quanta 5, owned by Emily Bobo, won the \$10,000 WEC Futures Prix at WEC – Wilmington.

Hunter Groom's Class




Homero Castaillon winning the Hunter Groom's Class with Cypress. *Photo by [Andrew Ryback Photography](#)*

Help Support David Beisel




Sunday Spotlights: The Twin Equestrians and Bryn Sadler
