



Meet the Palm Beach Equine Clinic Team: Dr. Natalia Novoa

I spent time with the farm's vet, and I learned how to do artificial insemination before I even finished high school. I liked the problem-solving aspect of it. I found it fascinating to have the ability to identify and understand what the problem was and then help relieve the suffering of animals after injuries or illnesses. It was an indescribable sensation. Nothing beats helping an animal when they are sick or in pain. There is nothing more rewarding than knowing you are making a difference in a horse's life. It is a very satisfying feeling.

I enjoy treating them as top athletes through the combined use of our practical skills, the new technology, and evolving therapies. When the Bone Breaks



Condylar fractures are most commonly seen in racehorses and polo ponies and were once considered career-ending injuries. Photo by Jump Media


A condylar fracture, most commonly seen in Thoroughbred racehorses and polo ponies, was once considered a career-ending injury. Advances in diagnostic imaging and surgical skillset have allowed Palm Beach Equine Clinic to quickly diagnose, treat, repair, and rehabilitate horses with condylar fractures.

What is a Condylar Fracture?
A condylar fracture is a repetitive concussive injury that results in a fracture to the cannon bone above the fetlock due to large loads transmitted over the cannon bone during high-speed exercise. On a radiograph, a condylar fracture appears as a crack that goes laterally up the cannon from the fetlock joint and out the side of the bone, essentially breaking off a corner of the cannon bone, sometimes up to six inches long.


